### **TUD CONTINUES FLUSHING WATER SYSTEM FLUSHING SCHEDULE WEEK OF FEBRUARY 15TH**

SONORA, CA: To ensure water quality, Tuolumne Utilities District (TUD) continues its flushing of the water distribution systems next week. The reason for the flushing is to clear out any sediment or minerals that may accumulate in pipes on an annual basis. Flushing will occur in the following areas next week:

#### **February 16th thru 19th**

Tuesday, 2/16 – Phoenix Lake  
Tuesday, 2/16 – Sonora Vista  
Tuesday, 2/16-Friday, 2/17 – Mono Vista  
Tuesday, 2/16-Friday, 2/19 – Scenic View  
Thursday, 2/18-Friday, 2/19 – Ranchos Poquitos

TUD will release an updated announcement of those scheduled areas as soon as they are confirmed and post the information on its website at [www.tudwater.com](http://www.tudwater.com). Please look for the TUD electronic signs for when we will be flushing in your neighborhood. TUD maintenance crews will flush between 8am and 3pm.

Please note, when TUD is flushing the water lines, we offer the following recommendations:

- Don't be alarmed if you observe substantial volumes of water flowing in drainages or alongside the road. This is typical for flushing.
- You may experience fluctuations in service pressure. If pressure problems persist, please contact the District.
- While flushing is occurring, we recommend not doing laundry and try to limit your water use in order not to draw this water into your household plumbing.
- If you have cloudy water after the water lines have been flushed, please turn on an outside hose bibb in order to flush your service line prior to where the water enters the house.

The Tuolumne Utilities District currently serves over 44,000 Tuolumne County residents. The District currently owns and operates 17 water treatment plants, 83 treated water storage tanks, two wastewater treatment plants, approximately 57 miles of open ditches and 296 miles of treated water pipeline.
